Issues for Provincial Election 2018

In June Queer Ontario released a list of seven issues we're urging the provincial Liberal government to address in the year remaining before the next provincial election to take place in June 2018. The issues include defunding of the Catholic School Board System; updating policies on blood donations for gay men; decriminalization of HIV non disclosures; reforming the Special Investigations Unit (SIU); addressing the gender pay gap; reinstating employment equity legislation; a call for sustainability in the Ontario Basic Income Pilot. Queer Ontario calls for End to Gender Pay Gap

Queer Ontario would like to see an end to the gender pay gap in this province, not only for the binary females and males, but for all varied genders and sexual orientations. Queer Ontario urges the provincial Liberal government to make movement on its gender wage gap initiative launched last fall at the Ministry of Labour and in doing so, to not limit its scope to the female/male gender binary. Queer Ontario calls upon the provincial government's Ministry of Labour to undertake its initiative to make the gender pay gap transparent in this province in a way that is consistent with the Ontario Human Rights Code that recognizes sexual orientation and gender identity and expression. Public Sex

Responding to the Fall 2016 arrests in Marie Curtis Park, Queer Ontario has joined a coalition of LGBTQ individuals and groups that is committed to raising awareness and providing a liberationist voice to men who have sex with men in parks and bathrooms. Queer Ontario has long recognized that gay, bisexual, trans-men and other men who selfidentify as men and who desire sexual contact with other men (MSM) have long used parks, washrooms, and other designated 'public' spaces as a venue to meet for friendship, pleasure and sex. This practice is not solely confined to LGBTQ folks and is a practice that has a pride of place in heterosexual culture as well. QO has joined a coalition of queer individuals who are fighting back against these arrests. Queer Liberation Theory Project Update

A major output for the Queer Liberation Theory (QLT) Project, a feature documentary entitled "QueerEdge: From Gay to Queer Liberation" has been completed. Queer people, as members of the gender and sexually diverse populations, include but are not limited to, 2-spirited, agender, ambigender, androgyne, asexual, bigender, bisexual, cross-dresser, drag queen, drag king, fluid, gay, gender fluid, genderqueer, intergender, intersex, intrasex, kink, lesbian, nongendered, omnisexual, pangender, pansexual, and transvestite.
